#### Nursery

This half term Nursery have been busy thinking about the different celebrations of Diwali, Hanukkah and Christmas. We made Rangoli patterns, diva lamps and painted hands with henna. Miss Toni and Mrs Archana both shared with us how they celebrate Diwali and Hanukkah with their families. We also talked about how we celebrate Christmas and enjoyed putting on our Christmas show for parents and Reception children.





This term we investigated dark and light by making dens, playing with torches and using our sensory room. When it was very cold we explored the ice and frost in the Nursery garden. We saw beautiful, sparkling spiderwebs covered in frost and wrapped up warm in our hats and gloves.

We used our 5 senses by guessing different smells in our smell pots, guessing what we were touching in our feely boxes, playing 'I spy' and going on a sensory walk with bare feet. We've explored different materials both man-made and natural and even made patterns with our foraged natural materials. We have also enjoyed listening to lots of stories including 'The Gruffalo' and 'Old McDonald Heard a Parp'. We learnt lots from Show Racism the Red Card day and from Sign me Happy who came in to teach us some sign language. Next term the children will continue learning more songs in Signed Supported English.

This half term year 1 looked at measuring length and height. We arranged rods in order of length and played games where our partner had to spot which rod had been moved.






In English we have written our own stories based on the book Owl Babies.

We went on a trip to The Lowry where we learnt about the Great Fire of London! We made collaborative art work...we even got to meet Stick Man!













Our first term in Year 6 has been very busy and we are proud of the BRILLIANT learning that has taken place. We have been learning about the amazon rainforest in geography.










Children have shown a real love of reading in their reading journals. Entries have been creative, thoughtful and reflective.







We have also written some lovely poems as part of poetry week, used our observation skills in science, learnt about scale in art and worked hard in maths










### Year 4

Year 4 have been learning about the Romans in history. We went to Chester














4JA have been learning all about states of matter in science. They have loved the topic and all the experiments it has involved, and they performed an amazing class assembly about their learning to their grownups!






#### Year 5


