

Year 6


In science, we have been learning about electricity. Here are some diagrams of circuits.

Nursery

It's a new term in Nursery and we have been busy in the Bee, Dragonfly and Ladybird rooms. We loved reading the Gingerbread Man story and acting it out. We made a story mountain plan and then changed the ending. Our new stories were very funny. In maths we have been learning about numbers 3, 4 and 5. We have been using words like number line, before, after and next. For Lunar New Year we celebrated by making lanterns and dragons. We ate noodles with sweet and sour sauce and performed our own Dragon Dance. In science we have been thinking about forces. Did you know that we can make something move if we PUSH or PULL it? Playing with magnets was fun and we explored which objects were magnetic. In art, we have been exploring paint using our hands and using natural materials as paint brushes.









It has continued to be cold, but we enjoy going outside every day to learn and play. It was so exciting when it snowed because we could make snowmen, snow angels and snowballs. The children are now used to the routines of the nursery day and their independence is growing when taking their shoes and socks off for PE or putting their coats and wellies on. It is so great seeing the children grow and thrive at Cavendish.

Year 5

In Design and Technology this half term, we have been looking at cooking our own spaghetti Bolognese. We have learnt about a traditional recipe and then researched ways to change it, thinking about different flavours we could add. Also, we examined the nutritional value of different ingredients and thought about how we can make a healthy meal. Finally, we did some cooking of our own in the revamped Cookery Room; we cut and sliced various fruit and vegetables for own Bolognese sauce, before tasting it of course! This really showcased our golden value of COURAGE. There were certainly a few children who weren't sure about trying something new, but pushed themselves to have a taste anyway. Almost all of them were happy they did!



















Year 3

In year 3, we have had a busy half term of maths, looking at all different areas of learning. The children enjoyed creating 3D shapes, discussing their properties and play What am I? By describing a shape's vertices and edges. There has been great progress and we're very proud of them.







In Science, we have started our new unit on Forces and Magnets. We started this unit off by investigating how far cars can travel on different surfaces. We found that paper was one of the fastest, as well as our hall floor! Bubble wrap and wool made the car slow down!







The children have also been learning about the features of a castle in preparation for a design and Technology project. They designed castles and then made their castles to match their design.















Year 4

In Art this term, Year 4 has been learning about using tints and shades to make objects look three-dimensional. We used our new skills to paint an art still life thinking about proportion of the objects and creating a lovely composition.





Our collaborative artwork inspired by Van Gogh 'Sunflowers.' Each child created their own sunflower using tints and shades which we added to a class vase. 4KE





To get us through the winter months, 4KE created a winter art piece. The sky is inspired by Van Gogh's Starry Night, we wove houses, used mark making to create snow and we turned ourselves into ice skaters. 4JA

4KF – still life with the theme Cavendish Primary using tints and shades.











Year 2

As part of our ongoing topic Seasons, we checked on the Spring bulbs we planted last Autumn. To our astonishment, the Daffodils and Crocus were breaking through the soil and our Snowdrops were in bloom!

We also went on a trip to Chester Zoo as part of our Science topic, 'Do Living Things Change or Stay the Same?' We all had a wonderful time despite the rain!







In maths we have







explored concepts of multiplication and division by grouping and sharing. We have also been adding and subtracting money using the measurements of pounds and pence. In literacy, the children have been discovering split digraphs such as a-e/e-e/i-e/o-e/u-e.
