We have been celebrating and learning all about CONNECTING as part of Children's Mental Health Week. https://www.childrensmentalhealthweek.org.uk/schools/




The theme this year was 'Let's Connect' and we reminded the children about the importance of togetherness and reaching out when it is needed.
